1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The Company is listed on the TSX Venture Exchange ("TSX.V") under the symbol "DLV.H". The address of the Company's registered and records office is 25th Floor, 700 West Georgia Street, Vancouver, BC V7Y 1B3.

The Company has not generated significant revenues from operations. As at August 31, 2020, the Company had working capital of \$2,213,069. The Company recorded a loss of \$171,244 for the nine months ended August 31, 2020, and had an accumulated deficit of \$18,690,474 at August 31, 2020. The Company does not currently have a recurring source of revenue. Although the Company has been successful in the past in obtaining financing, there is no assurance that it will be able to obtain adequate financing in the future or that such financing will be on terms that are acceptable to the Company.

2. BASIS OF PRESENTATION

Statement of compliance

The Company prepares its annual financial statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board and interpretations of the IFRS Interpretation Committee. These unaudited condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with IAS 34, Interim Financial Reporting and follow the same accounting policies and methods of application as the Company's most recent annual financial statements. Accordingly, they should be read in conjunction with the Company's most recent annual financial statements.

3. EXPLORATION AND EVALUATION ASSETS

British Columbia Property

The Company owns a mineral property located in the Skeena Mining Division in North Western British Columbia.

As at August 31, 2020, the carrying value of this property was \$nil.

4. SHARE CAPITAL

5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

As at August 31, 2020, \$954 (November 30, 2019: \$954) was included in amounts payable in the statements of financial position and due to a law firm where a former Company director and officer is a partner.

Key Management Compensation

Key management personnel include those persons having authority and responsibility for planning, directing and controlling the activities of the Company as a whole. The Company has determined that key management personnel consist of executive and non-executive members of the Company's Board of Directors and corporate officers. For the nine months ended August 31, 2020, key management compensation includes fees paid to directors of \$45,000 (2019: \$nil)

6. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Financial Risk Management and Fair Value Measurement

The Board of Directors has overall responsibility for the establishment and oversight of the Company's risk management framework. The Company's financial instruments consist of cash, amounts receivable, and amounts payable, and are held at amortized cost which approximates fair value due to the short-term nature of these financial instruments.

Financial Instrument Risk Exposure

The Company is exposed in varying degrees to a variety of financial instrument related risks. The type of risk exposure and the way in which such exposure is managed is provided as follows:

Credit Risk

Credit risk arises from the potential for non-performance by counterparties of contractual financial obligations. The Company is exposed to credit risk on cash and amounts receivable. The Company reduces its credit risk on cash by maintaining its bank account with a large international financial institution. The maximum exposure to credit risk is equal to the carrying value of its cash.

Financial Instrument Risk Exposure (continued)

Liquidity Risk

The Company's cash is invested in bank accounts which are available on demand. The liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will not be able to meet its financial obligations as they come due. The Company manages its liquidity risk through careful management of its financial obligations in relation to its cash position. Using budgeting processes, the Company manages its liquidity requirements based on expected cash flow to ensure there are adequate funds to meet the short term obligations during the period.

Market Risk

Market risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market risk comprises three types of risk:

i) Interest Rate Risk

The Company is nominally exposed to interest rate risk. The Company's cash earns interest at variable rates. The Company's future earned interest is exposed to short-term rate fluctuations. Interest rate exposure is considered to be insignificant.

ii) Foreign Currency Risk

The Company is not exposed to currency risk as all transactions are denominated in Canadian dollars.

iii) Price Risk

The Company is exposed to price risk with respect to equity prices. Equity price risk is defined as the potential adverse impact on the Company's earnings due to movements in individual equity prices or general movements in the level of the stock market. The Company closely monitors individual equity movements and the stock market to determine the appropriate course of action to be taken by the Company.

7. MANAGEMENT OF CAPITAL

The Company's objective when managing capital is to safeguard the Company's ability to continue as a going concern such that it can continue to provide returns for shareholders and benefits for other stakeholders.

The Company considers the items included in equity as capital. The Company manages the capital structure and makes adjustments to it in light of changes in economic conditions, business opportunity and the risk characteristics of the underlying assets. In order to maintain or adjust its capital structure, the Company may issue new shares or return capital to its shareholders. The Company is not subject to externally imposed capital requirements.

Management reviews its capital management approach on an ongoing basis. There was no change in the Company's management of capital policies during the periods presented.
