DESCRIPTION OF BUSINESS

MIZA III VENTURES INC. (the “Company”) is a company domiciled in Canada. The Company was incorporated on January 18, 2021 under the laws of the Province of British Columbia. The address of the Company’s registered and head office is Suite 600, 890 West Pender Street, Vancouver, B.C., V6C 1J9.

The Company was seeking to be a Capital Pool Corporation (“CPC”) as defined in Policy 2.4 of the TSX Venture Exchange (“Exchange”).

SHARE CAPITAL

Authorized

The Company is authorized to issue an unlimited number of common shares without nominal or par value.

Issued

On June 26, 2023, 100,000 Warrants were exercised for 100,000 shares @ \$0.10 for total of \$10,000.

Stock Options

The Company granted stock options to its directors and officers to purchase an aggregate of 500,000 common shares at a price of \$0.10 per common share exercisable for a period of five years from the date of grant on July 2021. The Company also granted warrants to its agent to purchase an aggregate of 200,000 common shares of which 100,000 are outstanding at the price of \$0.10 per share exercisable for a period of thirty months from the date of listing.

Escrow Shares

As of January 31, 2023, a total number of 3,000,000 shares are held in escrow. Pursuant to the terms of the escrow agreement, 750,000 of these shares will be released on the date of the QT completion and the remaining shares will be released over a period of 15 months.

RESULT OF OPERATIONS

Three Months ended October 31, 2023

During the period ended October 31, 2023, the Company recorded a loss of \$11,977. The loss is mainly due to professional fees of \$2,333 and filing fees incurred during the period. (October 31, 2022 - \$4,725)

LIQUIDITY AND CAPITAL RESOURCES

The Company's cash and cash equivalents on October 31, 2023, was \$1,227,669 compared to the January 31, 2023, balance of \$1,280,590. Working capital decreased to \$1,214,776 as of October 31, 2023, compared to \$1,274,804 as of January 31, 2023, due to normal operating expenses.

Cash used in operating activities for nine months ended October 31, 2023, was \$11,997 which was attributed to the loss during the period of \$70,028 (January 31, 2023 – \$79,864) and the changes in the working capital items comprising of decrease in accounts payable and accrued liabilities of \$11,197 (January 31, 2023 – \$8,498). Cash provided by financing activities for the period ended October 31, 2023, was \$10,000.

The Company's ability to continue on a going concern basis depends on its ability to successfully raise additional financing or ability to identify QT. Although the Company has been successful in the past in obtaining financing, there can be no assurance that it will be able to obtain adequate financing in the future or that the terms of such financing may be favorable.

As of October 31, 2023, the Company has no material cash contractual obligations.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During the nine months ended October 31, 2023, the Company accrued \$9,450 (2022 - \$3,000) office administration fees to a director of the Company.

During the nine months ended October 31, 2023, the Company accrued \$14,175 (2022 - \$4,500) for office rent to a director of the Company.

During the nine months ended October 31, 2023, the Company accrued \$4,825 (2022 - \$1,500) in accounting fees to a director of the Company, which was included in accounting fees.

OFF-BALANCE SHEET ARRANGEMENTS

The Company has no material undisclosed off-balance sheet arrangements that have or are reasonably likely to have, a current or future effect on our results of operations or financial condition.

LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

The Company has not been a party to any legal proceedings since inception.

COMMITMENTS

The Company has no long-term commitments.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

In conducting its business, the Company faces a number of risks and uncertainties related to the mineral exploration industry. Some of these risk factors include risks associated with land titles, exploration and development, government and environmental regulations, permits and licenses, competition, dependence on key personnel, the requirement and ability to raise additional capital through future financings.

Future Financings

The Company's continued operation will be dependent upon the ability to generate operating revenues and to procure additional financing. There can be no assurance that any such revenues can be generated or that other financing can be obtained on acceptable terms. Failure to obtain additional financing on a timely basis may cause the Company to postpone development plans, forfeit rights in some or all of the properties or joint ventures, or reduce or terminate some or all of the operations.

Dependence on Key Personnel

The success of the Company is currently largely dependent on the performance of the directors and officers. There is no assurance that the Company will be able to maintain the services of the directors and officers, or other qualified personnel required to operate its business. The loss of the services of these persons could have a material adverse effect on the Company and the prospects.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The Company's financial statements and the other financial information included in this management report are the responsibility of the Company's management and have been examined and approved by the Board of Directors. The financial statements were prepared by management in accordance with generally accepted Canadian accounting principles and include certain amounts based on management's best estimates using careful judgment. The selection of accounting principles and methods is management's responsibility.

Management recognizes its responsibility for conducting the Company's affairs in a manner to comply with the requirements of applicable laws and established financial standards and principles, and for maintaining proper standards of conduct in its activities.

The Board of Directors supervises the financial statements and other financial information through its audit committee, which is comprised of a majority of non-management directors.

This committee's role is to examine the financial statements and recommend that the Board of Directors approve them, to examine the internal control and information protection systems and all other matters relating to the Company's accounting and finances. In order to do so, the audit committee meets annually with the external auditors, with or without the Company's management, to review their respective audit plans and discuss the results of their examination. This committee is responsible for recommending the appointment of the external auditors or the renewal of their engagement.
