

This is the annual Management Report of Fund Performance (MRFP) for the year ended November 30, 2025. This MRFP contains financial highlights but does not contain the complete financial statements of the Company. The annual financial statements and accompanying notes are attached to this report.

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND STRATEGIES

TDb Split Corp. invests primarily in common shares of the Toronto-Dominion Bank ("TD Bank").

The Company offers two types of shares:

Priority Equity shares (XTD.PR.A)

The investment objectives with respect to the Priority Equity shares are as follows:

1. to provide holders of Priority Equity Shares with cumulative preferential monthly cash dividends in the amount of \$0.05833 per share, to yield 7.0% annually, based on the \$10 repayment amount (previously \$0.04375 per share, yielding 5.25% annually); and
2. on or about the termination date of December 1, 2029 (subject to further 5 year extensions thereafter), to pay holders the Priority Equity share repayment amount of \$10 per share.

Class A shares (XTD)

The investment objectives with respect to the Class A shares are as follows:

1. to provide holders of Class A shares with regular monthly cash dividends in the amount of \$0.05 per Class A share when the net asset value per unit exceeds \$12.50; and
2. to permit such holders to participate in all growth in the net asset value of the Company above \$10.00 per unit.

RISK

The risks of investing in the Company remain as discussed in the Annual Information Form dated February 23, 2026. In addition, note 5 of the financial statements ("Management of Risk of Financial Instruments") contains disclosure on specific types of risks related to the financial investments held by the Company.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

North American equity markets delivered positive performance during the year ended November 30, 2025, with Canadian equities demonstrating relative resilience amid ongoing macroeconomic and policy uncertainty. In Canada, equity markets were supported in part by strength in select sectors including materials, energy and financials, contributing to generally favourable returns despite intermittent volatility related to global trade policy developments and economic data releases. Investor sentiment improved over the course of the year as inflation moderated and financial conditions became more supportive, though confidence remained sensitive to evolving macroeconomic conditions.

Canada's economy showed some resilience despite external pressures, avoiding a technical recession as growth rebounded modestly in the third quarter. This rebound reflected increased public-sector capital spending and government program outlays, including infrastructure projects and public services, as well as a recovery in exports. Housing activity stabilized at subdued levels, while consumer spending remained constrained amid a softer labour market.

The Bank of Canada continued to ease monetary policy in response to moderating inflation and ongoing economic softness, including weak consumer demand, slowing business investment and uncertainty surrounding international trade and tariffs. The overnight rate was reduced from 3.75% at the beginning of December 2024 to 2.25% by the end of the year. These lower interest rates supported financial markets by easing borrowing costs and supporting asset valuations, particularly in interest-sensitive sectors. Lower interest rates also contributed to a partial normalization of the yield curve from previously inverted levels, which was generally supportive for the Canadian financial sector by easing pressure on lending conditions and net interest margins. Declining fixed-income yields also increased the relative attractiveness of dividend-paying equities, with higher relative dividend yields providing incremental support to equity market performance.

Trade policy developments and geopolitical dynamics also influenced market conditions throughout the year. Ongoing trade related uncertainty involving Canada's major trading partners affected business confidence and trade flows, contributing to periodic market volatility. In this environment, the Canadian financial sector, and Canada's largest banks, continued to contribute to market performance, supported by generally resilient earnings and strong capital and liquidity positions, even as slower credit growth and cost pressures became more evident in certain segments.

As at November 30, 2025, net assets of the Company were \$81.9 million (November 30, 2024 - \$87.8 million) and net assets per unit of the Company were \$16.97 (November 30, 2024 - \$11.15, prior to giving effect to the consolidation of Class A shares on a 0.5 for 1 basis on December 12, 2024). During the year ended November 30, 2025, net proceeds from share issuances were \$17.3 million and redemptions totaled \$44.1 million. Redemptions included payments made pursuant to the special retraction right in connection with the extension of the termination date of the Company from December 1, 2024 to December 1, 2029, under which the Company redeemed 4,409,314 Priority Equity shares and 6,014 Class A shares on December 16, 2024.


The share price of TD Bank appreciated by 48.49% during the year ended November 30, 2025.

During the year ended November 30, 2025, the Company sold 1,362,300 Priority Equity shares and 929,700 Class A shares through an at-the-market equity program (the "ATM Program") at average selling prices of \$10.42 per Priority Equity share and \$3.83 per Class A share, respectively. Gross proceeds, net proceeds and commissions on the Priority Equity share sales were \$14.2 million, \$13.9 million and \$0.3 million, respectively, while gross proceeds, net proceeds and commissions on the Class A share sales were \$3.6 million, \$3.5 million and \$0.1 million, respectively.

The dividend income from the common shares of TD Bank is supplemented by income received from a selective covered call writing program.

Total distributions per Class A share during the year amounted to \$0.55.



RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

Escalating global military tensions and continued uncertainty in global trade relations may contribute to market volatility and could impact the Company's investment portfolio.

Pursuant to the special retraction right in connection with the extension of the termination date of the Company from December 1, 2024 to December 1, 2029, the Company redeemed 4,409,314 Priority Equity shares and 6,014 Class A shares and made retraction payments of \$44,093,140 and \$6,916, respectively, to each class of shares on December 9, 2024.

Following the special retraction payment, and in order to restore balance in the number of shares outstanding for each class of shares, Class A shares were consolidated on the basis of 0.5 post consolidation Class A shares for every 1 pre-consolidation Class A share outstanding on December 12, 2024. A total of 3,878,773 Class A shares were consolidated.

In connection with the extension, the Company also amended the dividend entitlement of the Priority Equity shares, increasing the annual distribution rate to 7.0% from 5.25% effective December 1, 2024.

Quadravest Capital Management Inc. ("Quadravest") as investment manager and manager earns fees from the Company as described below in the Management Fees section.

- (1) Net assets per unit is the difference between the aggregate amount of the Company's assets and the aggregate amount of its liabilities, excluding Priority Equity shares and net assets attributable to holders of redeemable Class A shares, at the valuation date, divided by the number of units then outstanding.
- (2) Total increase (decrease) from operations is before the payment of Class A shares and Priority Equity shares and other income (charges) related to the Priority Equity shares and is calculated based on the weighted average number of units outstanding during the year.
- (3) Distributions on the Priority Equity shares and Class A shares are based on the number of Priority Equity shares and Class A shares outstanding on the record date for each distribution in the year and were paid in cash. Characterization of distributions is based on the tax treatment that is received by investors.
- (4) As a result of the consolidation of Class A shares on a 0.5 for 1 basis on December 12, 2024, after the payment of special retractions in December 2024 in connection with the extension of the termination date of the Company, comparative figures from prior years are not comparable to the figures presented as at November 30, 2025.
- (5) After giving effect to the consolidation of Class A shares on a 0.5 for 1 basis on December 12, 2024, which occurred subsequent to year-end, net assets per unit and net assets per Class A share as at November 30, 2024 were \$12.30 and \$2.30, respectively.
- (6) The net assets per unit, beginning of the year is based on net assets per Class A share of \$1.15 prior to giving effect to the consolidation of Class A shares on a 0.5 for 1 basis on December 12, 2024. The net assets per Class A share and net asset per unit at the beginning of the year, after giving effect to the subsequent share consolidation, were \$2.30 and \$12.30, respectively.

- (2) At times when there is an unequal number of Class A and Priority Equity shares outstanding, a notional unit amount will be determined as the quotient of the total net asset value of the Company and the sum of the net asset value per share attributable to Class A shares and Priority Equity shares.
- (3) A separate base management expense ratio per unit has been presented to reflect the ongoing operating expenses of the Company. The base management expense ratio per unit is based on total expenses for the stated year, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, distributions on Priority Equity shares and any one time offering expenses and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the average net asset value of the Company during the year.
- (4) Share issue expenses including all agents' fees and other offering expenses are one time initial expenses connected with the launch of the Company or any subsequent secondary offering. Any expenses incurred with secondary offerings were offset by the accretion to net asset value per unit of such offerings.
- (5) Management expense ratio per Class A share is based on the requirements of NI 81-106. This instrument requires that all split share companies produce an expense ratio which allocates all ongoing operating expenses of the Company (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs), all distributions on Priority Equity shares and all issuance costs to the Class A shares and expresses this as an annualized percentage of the average net asset value attributable to the Class A shares during the year. The management expense ratio per Class A share should not be interpreted as the required return necessary for the Company or the Class A shares to cover the operating expenses of the Company. This calculation is based only on a portion of the Company's assets whereas the Company utilizes its entire assets to generate investment returns. Management believes that the base management expense ratio per unit disclosed in the table above is the most representative ratio in assessing the ongoing efficiency of the administration of the Company, making comparisons to the expense ratios of single unit mutual funds or determining the minimum investment returns necessary by the Company to achieve growth in net asset value per unit.
- (6) The Company's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively Quadravest manages the portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Company buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The Company employs a covered call writing strategy which can cause the portfolio turnover rate to be higher than conventional mutual funds. The higher the Company's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Company in the year and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Company.
- (7) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of the average net asset value of the Company during the year.

MANAGEMENT FEES

Pursuant to the terms of the investment management agreement, Quadrainvest is entitled to a base management fee payable in arrears at an annual rate equal to 0.55% of the net asset value of the Company, which includes the outstanding Priority Equity shares, calculated as at each month-end valuation date.

Pursuant to the management agreement, Quadrainvest is entitled to an administration fee payable monthly in arrears at an annual rate equal to 0.1% of the net asset value of the Company, which includes the outstanding Priority Equity shares, calculated as at each month-end valuation date.




The base management fee was used by Quadrainvest to provide investment analysis, make investment decisions, and make brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of securities including the covered call writing program. The administration fee was used to provide or arrange administrative services required by the Company which includes all operational services, financial accounting, shareholder reporting and regulatory reporting.

PAST PERFORMANCE

Year-by-Year Returns
