MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund’s objectives are to provide a high level of interest income and some opportunity for growth in the value of your investment. The Fund invests primarily in bonds and debentures maturing in more than one year, issued by governments and corporations around the world and by supranational agencies such as the World Bank.

The portfolio manager seeks to optimize portfolio holdings in an effort to mitigate portfolio risk, while seeking superior risk-adjusted returns. The portfolio manager uses a fundamental driven process focused on duration management, yield curve positioning, country allocation, security selection and asset allocation into highly rated agencies. The portfolio manager will select bonds based on their overall liquidity and with respect to the overall size of the issuing country. The portfolio manager may use general environmental, social and governance (“ESG”) integration in the security selection process. The Fund’s foreign currency exposure is typically fully hedged.

Risk

The risks associated with an investment in the Fund remain as disclosed in the Fund’s most recent simplified prospectus or any amendments thereto, and fund facts. During the Period, there were no changes to the Fund that materially affected the overall risk level associated with an investment in the Fund. However, on May 2024, the Manager reviewed the Fund using the standardized investment risk classification methodology prescribed by

National Instrument 81-102 *Investment Funds* and determined that the risk rating had not changed. The Manager reviews the Fund’s investment risk level and reference index, if any, at least annually.

Results of Operations

During the Period, the Fund’s total net asset value changed from approximately \$211 million to approximately \$227 million. Series A units of the Fund returned 8.09%. Please see the *Past Performance* section for information on the performance returns of the Fund’s other series.

Fixed income markets delivered strong returns over the Period, primarily due to a change in interest rate expectations as the U.S. Federal Reserve Board (“Fed”) laid the groundwork for less restrictive monetary policy. However, the subsequent euphoria in fixed income markets was short-lived as U.S. data on jobs, growth, and inflation was surprisingly strong, triggering concerns that interest rates would remain high. Increased evidence of a cooling labour market and signs of disinflationary pressures led to extremely weak labour market numbers in July.

At its September meeting, the Fed cut interest rates by 50 basis points to maintain labour market strength. The European Central Bank (“ECB”) and Bank of Canada both cut interest rates during the Period. However, the Bank of Japan raised interest rates as a buoyant labour market pushed wages and prices upward.

The effects of geopolitical risk were muted in the absence of oil price gains despite escalating conflict in the Middle East.



Mutual Funds

BMO World Bond Fund

Throughout the Period, price movements in the U.S. Treasury market set the tone for bond markets worldwide. Credit outperformed government debt as investors viewed valuations through an expected decline in discount rates, easier financing conditions and robust credit fundamentals.

The Fund's long position in duration (interest rate-sensitive holdings) contributed to outperformance as the Fund's U.S. exposure was trimmed in response to the stronger tone of economic data in the second quarter. Exposure was subsequently rebuilt when it became clearer that inflation was heading downward. The Fund's positions in the U.S. and Germany contributed to outperformance as weaker-than-expected U.S. labour market data led to significant steepening of yield curves in these countries, generating capital gains. The Fund's exposure to emerging market debt, including the local currency South African government debt market, contributed to performance due to tactical investments surrounding the election.

The Fund's underweight position in credit detracted from outperformance, as did its underweight position in China.

New positions included exposure to corporate debt through the new issue market. The Fund also built up exposure to government-related and supranational debt, using both the primary and the secondary market.

Increased positions included the Fund's yield curve steepening strategies in the U.S. and Europe, as well as its exposure to South Africa.

Decreased positions included the Fund's exposure to gilts amid uncertainty over the next U.K. budget.

Eliminated positions included the Fund's overweight position in Spain versus France, following strong performance.

Multi-Series Structure Change

As at the close of business on August 16, 2024, Classic Series Units were terminated.

Recent Developments

Geopolitical risk represents a major source of uncertainty facing global markets. While the Ukraine-Russia conflict seems to have entered a period of stasis, events in the Middle East could deteriorate. Any sustained interruption to the oil supply could cause an uptick in inflation, especially in the eurozone.

Political risk in the U.S. will likely increase closer to the U.S. presidential election. Despite some weakness in the manufacturing sector, the U.S. economy remains resilient.

Growth in Europe appears likely to slow, and inflation may continue undershooting the ECB's 2% target. This could provide scope for a slightly faster pace of monetary easing. The portfolio manager believes the pace of projected interest rate cuts by the Fed and the ECB is relatively aligned, suggesting the ECB should be able to cut interest rates without triggering any unwanted strength in the euro.

Uncertainty in the U.K. over fiscal policy and labour market dynamics means that current monetary policy will likely steadily continue.

Credit fundamentals will likely remain positive amid relatively low levels of corporate leverage and relatively high levels of interest rate cover in the U.S. and Europe. One challenge for credit is the richness of valuations relative to historical levels, which is likely to remain in place.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

From time to time, the Manager may, on behalf of the Fund, enter into transactions or arrangements with or involving other members of BMO Financial Group, or certain other persons or companies that are related or connected to the Manager (each, a "Related Party"). The purpose of this section is to provide a brief description of any transaction involving the Fund and a Related Party.

Manager

BMO Investments Inc., an indirect, wholly-owned subsidiary of Bank of Montreal ("BMO"), is the Manager and trustee of the Fund. The Manager is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services, which is described in the "Management Fees" section later in this document.

Administration Fee and Operating Expenses

The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to the Manager in respect of each series other than Series I. The Manager in return pays the operating expenses of these series of the Fund, other than certain specified expenses that are paid directly by the Fund (“Fund Expenses”). Fund Expenses are allocated proportionately among the relevant series. If the Fund Expenses are specific to a series, the Fund Expenses are allocated to that series. The fixed administration fee is calculated as a fixed annual percentage of the net asset value of each relevant series of the Fund. The annual fixed administration fee rate for each series of the Fund, other than Series I, is 0.30%. The administration fee is subject to applicable taxes. The Manager may, in certain cases, waive a portion of the administration fee that it receives from the Fund or from certain series of the Fund. Separate fees and expenses are negotiated and paid directly by each Series I investor. Buying and Selling Securities

During the Period and pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on standing instructions provided by the independent review committee (“IRC”) with respect to one or more of the following related party transactions (each, a “Related Party Transaction”):

- (a) investments in securities issued by BMO;
- (b) investments in a class of securities of an issuer during the period of distribution of those securities to the public and/or the 60-day period following the distribution period where a related party dealer acted as an underwriter in the distribution;
- (c) trades in debt securities of any issuer from or to a related party dealer acting as principal; and
- (d) trades of a security of any issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by the Manager or an affiliate of the Manager.

In accordance with the IRC’s standing instructions, in making a decision to cause the Fund to enter into a Related Party Transaction, the Manager and the portfolio manager of the Fund are required to comply with the Manager’s written policies and procedures governing the Related Party Transaction and, among other things, advise the IRC of non-compliance with the applicable policies and procedures. The governing policies and procedures are designed to ensure that each Related Party Transaction (i) is made free from any influence of BMO, BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc. or an associate or affiliate of BMO and/or BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc., and without taking into account any considerations relevant to BMO, BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc. or an associate or affiliate of BMO and/or BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc.; (ii) represents the business judgment of the Manager and/or portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (iii) is in compliance with the Manager’s written policies and procedures; and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Other Transactions with a Related Party

During the Period and pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on standing instructions and positive recommendations provided by the IRC with respect to engaging a Related Party as a derivatives counterparty or service provider.

Distribution Services

The Manager markets and distributes the Fund through BMO branches and/or (depending on the series) through registered dealers and brokers, including BMO InvestorLine Inc. and BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc., both affiliates of the Manager. The Manager pays to these affiliates a service fee called a “trailing commission” based on the average daily value of the units that are held in investor accounts. This service fee is paid monthly or quarterly and varies by purchase option and by series.

⁽⁴⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio manager manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

Management Fees

The Manager is responsible for the day-to-day management of the business and operations of the Fund. The Manager monitors and evaluates the Fund's performance, pays for the investment advice provided by the Fund's portfolio manager and provides certain administrative services required by the Fund. As compensation for its services, the Manager is entitled to receive a management fee payable monthly, calculated based on the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund at the annual rate set out in the table below. The management fee is subject to applicable taxes. The Manager may, at its discretion, waive a portion or the entire amount of the management fee chargeable at any given time for each series of the Fund.

⁽¹⁾ For Series I Units, separate Series I fees are negotiated and paid directly by each Series I investor. The combined management and administration fees for Series I Units will not exceed the management fee charged for Advisor Series or Series A Units.

PAST PERFORMANCE

The Fund's performance information assumes that all distributions made by the Fund in the periods shown were reinvested in additional securities of the Fund and is based on the net asset value of the Fund. The reinvestment of distributions increases returns. The performance information does not take into account sales, redemption, distribution, other optional charges or income taxes payable that, if applicable, would have reduced returns or performance. Please remember that how the Fund has performed in the past does not indicate how it will perform in the future.

The returns of each series may differ from one another for a number of reasons, including if the series was not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period and because of the different levels of management fees and expenses allocated and payable by each series.

On May 4, 2018, Columbia Threadneedle Management Limited (formerly, BMO Asset Management Limited) was appointed as the sub-advisor for this fund. In addition, the investment strategies of the Fund changed to reflect the investment style of BMO Asset Management Limited.


On May 27, 2022, BMO Asset Management Inc., an affiliate of the Manager, ceased to act as portfolio manager of the Fund and Columbia Threadneedle Management Limited (formerly BMO Asset Management Limited) became the portfolio manager of the Fund.

Year-by-Year Returns



Series A Units




