In accordance with its articles of incorporation in order to preserve its net asset value, the distribution for the month of July will not be paid on the class A shares of Dividend Growth Split Corp. ("DGS") as the net asset value per unit (consisting of one class A share and one preferred share) for DGS as at July 18, 2019 (after taking into account the potential payment of the distribution) was less than \$15.00. DGS will re-evaluate the payment of class A share distributions in each month with the expectation that monthly distributions will be announced if the net asset value per unit meets this requirement.
